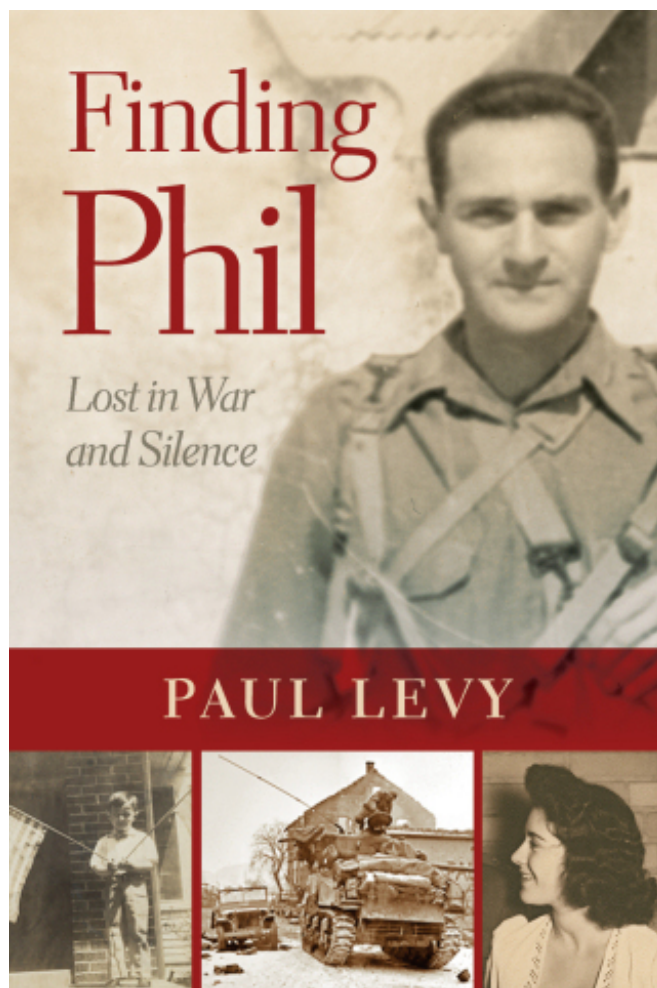


## **Genealogy Club/Author Talk: Finding Phil**

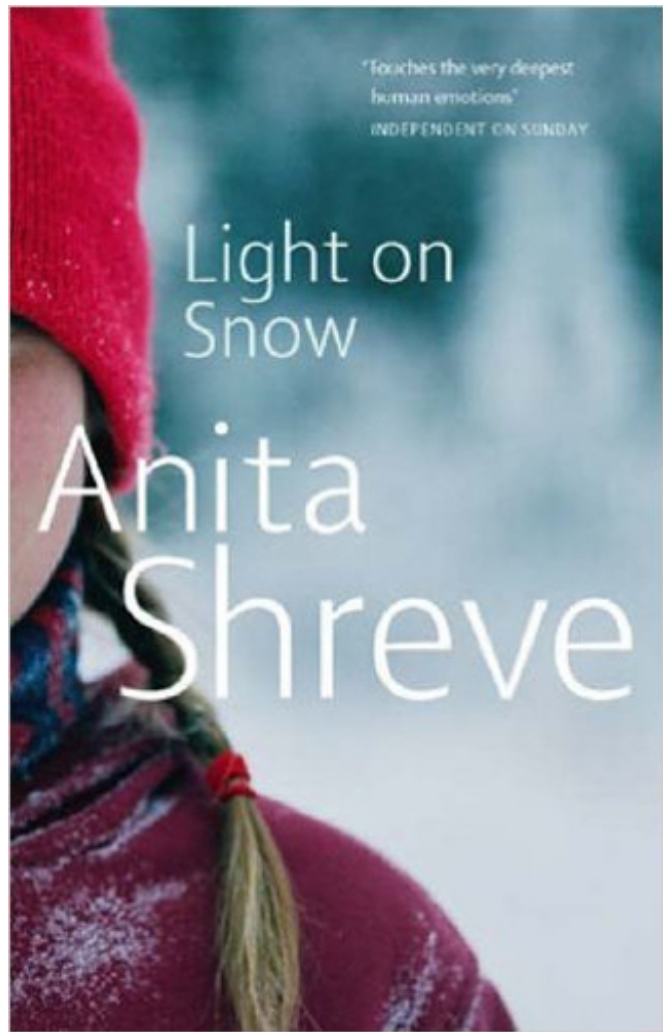


### **Evening Book Discussion**
